# **Remembering Child Passenger Safety Heroes**



#### **Cheryl Neverman**

Some people really make a difference in other people's lives - and by doing so they make a difference in the world. They do the right things because they need to be done, not because they are asked to or because they expect personal gain.

Such people rarely receive the credit, compensation, or thanks they deserve. They and their ideas are instead often rejected, but these few know that they are making the right choices and that they can make a difference. They take joy in what they create and share.

Cheryl Neverman was one of those beautiful heroes.

Cheryl Neverman, a truly creative, passionate leader for child passenger safety, passed away in July after a valiant struggle against cancer. Those of you who became involved in CPS in the past 10 years or so may never have heard of her and her momentous work for CPS. For those of us who were active in the 80's and 90's, she was a friend, mentor and inspiration.

She began, as did many of the early CPS Advocates, in her young children's school parent-teacher association during the late 1970's. She received one of the first PTA grants from NHTSA and General Motors for CPS promotion. Cheryl graduated to the state level, managing the CPS program for the Iowa Highway Safety Bureau and then moved on to New York City to be director of safety education in the Department of Transportation. From there, she went to NHTSA to work in the Office of Occupant Protection in 1990, where she remained until her retirement this past winter.

For me and many others, the highpoint of the first half of Cheryl's 22 years at NHTSA was her championing of the first Standardized Child Passenger Safety Certification Program, which became a reality in her capable hands. She also was influential as a liaison to the Committee on Injury, Violence, and Poison Prevention of the American Academy of Pediatrics. In later years, she worked on youth traffic safety at NHTSA, fostering the National Organization for Youth Safety (NOYS), and helped lead the federal Inter-Agency Coordinating Committee on Prevention Underage Drinking.

I knew Cheryl for over 30 years and was always amazed by her seemingly endless energy, creativity, and commitment to children and teens. Her enthusiasm was infectious, and she could communicate effectively with everyone from physicians to parents, from federal bureaucrats to used car dealers. In addition, she was a committed friend to many and parent to three fine children. I and many of us in the CPS field will greatly miss her.

#### **Lt. Joel Bolton** Lake Charles, LA

From KPLC TV, Lake Charles LA By John Bridges May 16, 2012

When Joel Bolton was only 12 years old, his niece, Ginger, was killed in an automobile accident. There were no child safety seats back then and seat belts were rarely used. The incident so affected Bolton that he decided to become a police officer.

"That bothered Joel and when he went into law enforcement, it was for passenger safety and car seats and things like that," said Sandy Bolton, his widow. "Joel was the number 3 person in the country to be certified in child seat inspections and installations. Now there are over 300,000."

After 25 years with the Lake Charles Police Department, Bolton moved to Washington, DC to work for the Department of Transportation...writing national programs on child seat and passenger safety.

"He was successful in law enforcement and passenger safety because he had a pure passion for Ginger and her death. That's how he would want to be remembered. That would be his legacy."

Bolton died of a heart attack in March of 2012, leaving behind his wife and a 4 year old daughter, Jolie.


Dr. Wang is Professor of Surgery and attending trauma surgeon at the University of Michigan Trauma Center. He is the founding director of the International Center for Automotive Medicine and director of the multidisciplinary Program for Injury Research and Education. Since 2006, Dr. Wang has directed a FHWA/Michigan DOT-funded program to improve crash scene emergency care by training EMS and medical personnel to better predict crash injuries using advanced automatic collision notification data.


