

Car Seat Tolerance Testing: Who, What, When, Where and Why

Pediatric Heatstroke Deaths in Vehicles

This spring the field of child passenger safety lost the original advocate for protecting children in motor vehicles: Annemarie Shelness. Starting as a mother whose fourth child had entered school, she teamed with Seymour Charles, MD, pediatrician, to promote the use of crash-tested safety seats. As Executive Director of Physicians for Automotive Safety, she played a leading role in producing the first accurate educational film with matching brochures and in prodding the government to regulate appropriately. She mentored younger mothers who started Action for Child Transportation Safety and was a source of technical expertise for Women for Political and Social Action Child Safety Project, leading to the founding in 1980 of L.A. Area Child Passenger Safety Association, which ultimately became SafetyBeltSafe U.S.A. Annemarie was an elegant, meticulous leader who was highly grounded in research findings and modeled the kind of fact-based approach that has been essential in the field. Her film, Don't Risk Your Child's Life, has just been updated in its ninth edition. We will miss her and believe she has set a standard to which all of us can aspire. Stephanie Tombrello

She worked diligently to build partnerships with emergency service and community agencies, and she helped to create more than 40 Fitting Station locations throughout the Tri-State area. Most importantly, countless children are alive and safe today because of Susan's passion and her tireless commitment to keeping kids safe.

Susan could be seen on a regular basis presenting the latest information on child passenger safety at KIDZ IN MOTION, state CPS conferences and LifeSavers conferences. She worked closely with Evenflo, an Ohio car seat manufacturer, to develop and critique new CPS products. We considered her an expert on LATCH and always enjoyed teaching certification classes with her.

But beyond her impressive career in the CPS community, Susan was a dear friend, colleague and mentor.
