# Jennifer Penick

On Monday, June 25, 2018, Jennifer Penick, her husband Adam, and her youngest daughter were in a car crash. Tragically, Jennifer and Adam did not survive the crash; their daughter, Unity, is recovering from an injury to her arm. Unity is a testament to Jennifer's passion to educate parents and caregivers on the importance of child passenger safety.

Jennifer certified as a Child Passenger Safety Technician in 2006, and for the next 12 years educated and advocated for best practices with car seats and vehicle safety. She also completed the Safe Travel For All Children course for Transporting children with special healthcare needs.

In addition to the work she did locally, Jennifer was an integral part of the non-profit organization, Car Seats for the Littles (CSFTL). As one of the founding members of the organization, Jennifer worked to ensure the safety of countless children nationwide. CSFTL reaches more than 250,000 parents and caregivers each month on its website, offering necessary information about child passenger safety, providing guidance on the proper installation and use of car seats, and listing resources and tips to help keep "the littles" safe. For more than 5 years, Jennifer was there to help, to guide, and to keep children safe.

Jennifer and Adam leave behind five children who grew with CSFTL and starred in many articles and product reviews. As an organization, as the people who worked with her daily, and as her friends we are grateful for the many contributions she made and the legacy she leaves. We will miss her dearly.

Even in countries with the highest rates of child restraint usage, children travel without an appropriate restraint on at least one in five journeys. Height-less booster seats are a new option, and can offer the same protection as traditional backless belt-positioning boosters, in a significantly more compact and portable size, eliminating the chance of children traveling without a suitable restraint. Jon will explain how height-less booster seats work and will review the scientific substantiation for their safety and efficacy.





# The Evolution of Boston Children's Inpatient Child **Passenger Safety Program**

Barbara Digirolamo, Boston Children's Hospital barbara.digirolamo@childrens.harvard.edu To improve child passenger safety for patients, Boston Children's Hospital developed a child passenger safety (CPS) program for children admitted to the hospital. A computerized assessment tool was developed which identifies children less than 8 years old in need of a car seat at the time of discharge and initiates a consult for the CPS program. Since the hospital-wide program initiation, Barbara and her team have provided over 1,300 seats and educated over 1,600 patients through consults alone. The current program encompasses all inpatient units, including children with special health care needs and spica casts, which allows the reduction in ambulance needs for discharge.

# **Trends, Techs and Tools**

Checkups show >90% of child restraints are used incorrectly. Restraint complexity, innovations, and inconsistency between manufacturers lead to errors. Few parents or non-CPS professionals recognize the importance of using manufacturers' instructions; CPSTs must model instruction use during outreach education and every seat check. The compilation of instructions/summaries is an essential tool, providing instructions with updated summaries of key installation details for more than 400 seats since 2008. Consequences of practice without regularly updated tools will be featured in installation scenarios and will demonstrate how CPSTs can use the tool for awareness of features, installation complexities, clarifications, and manufacturer updates.
