

#### **Oklahoma Legend: Martha Collar**

Martha Collar is remembered for her gift of saving children's lives. During her 19 years working in injury prevention, she was Director of Safe Kids Oklahoma and diligently worked to improve policies affecting the safety of child passengers, teen drivers, and ATV riders. Resilient and determined, she epitomized the spirit of the Little Engine that Could, I think I can, I think I can, consistently achieving the seemingly impossible and ultimately saving innumerable lives.

In 2007 Martha lost her battle with leukemia, and the child passenger safety community lost a pioneer and true hero. To recognize her years of dedication to childhood injury prevention, The Martha Collar Tech Reunion began in 2008. Each year we continue to honor CPS Technicians and Instructors who build on Martha's legacy of excellence.



Martha began with Oklahoma University Children's Hospital in public relations. There she was responsible for bringing Safe Kids to Oklahoma in the mid 90's and was the director until 2007. She was instrumental in changing legislation, heralding the passed Oklahoma Booster Seat Bill requiring safety seats for all children under 6.

Martha generously shared her knowledge – she would rather have 100 people know how to share the message than just one! Even though her name was known throughout the nation as an expert in her field, she always wanted the attention to be on the program and the kids and not herself. Her impact goes well beyond CPS.

In a piece Martha wrote before she passed away, she said, "Life is more than what we DO--it is about who we ARE." Her battle with leukemia taught her to be "less tolerant of nonsense." For her that meant there is no time in our brief lives to be petty and mean. At the same time, she knew the importance of not taking life too seriously and that we should make time to "have fun and laugh and throw a party."

In her honor, we take time this week to celebrate the lives we work hard to save and life itself! Martha concluded her thoughts, "Where there is life, there is hope."
