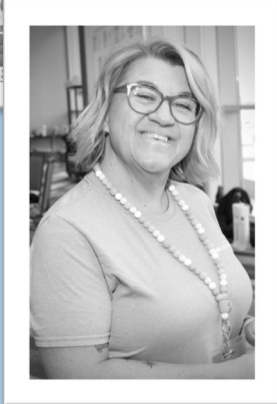

What Can I Do When a Conventional Car Seat Doesn't Work?

CPSTs are challenged every day with assisting passengers with complex transportation needs. Many can safely use conventional car seats. However, those with more complex needs may not be able to safely use the car seat they currently have.
